ECTOR COUNTY LAW ENFORCEMENT DETENTION CENTER**

The Ector County Law Enforcement Detention Center is in need of a Charge Nurse to work in the Jail with male and female inmates. The Charge Nurse will be under the direct supervision of the Director of Nurses and under the general supervision of the Sheriff's Office and County Health Authority Physician.

PRIMARY DUTIES: Charge Nurse will be responsible for assisting in the clinic when the LVN is in need of assistance. They are a reference for the LVN in case an opinion is in need, or the LVN does not feel comfortable with their assessment. The Charge Nurse is in charge of evaluations of the LVN, monitoring the TB list and ordering chest x-rays when needed, ordering medications and having medications refilled, picked up by transport and all appointments outside of the facility, and coordinating them with transport. The Charge Nurse is in charge of reporting abnormal lab values to the MD and treating as necessary.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: High school diploma or GED, have education in nursing from an accredited School of Nursing, Registered Nurse with current Texas licensure, Supervisory experience in team leader role, work experience as a professional nurse, CPR certification, preferred education and experience with a minimum of one (1) year experience as RN in hospital setting in preferred.

SALARY: DOE \$28.54 to \$32.10 p/h plus excellent benefits; work days & hours: Monday-Friday; 8:00am-5:00pm
